- Mark all locations on a map of South America.
- Final copy will be an electronic poster. Proofread to check for spelling or grammar errors. You will submit your electronic poster through Canvas.
- All information should be written in your own words.
- Final product: 100 points!
 - o 10 points: Title of your choice
 - o 10 points: Locations marked on your map of South America organized with labels (It may be helpful to number the map to match your descriptions)
 - o 10 points: Explanations of 2 sentences for each country you are visiting
 - 40 points: Descriptions of 10 locations in complete sentences (1-2 sentences for each location)
 - 10 points: Activity descriptions—Choose activities that are realistic and appropriate for the locations
 - o 10 points: Correct spelling and grammar
 - o 10 points: Neatness and creativity
