
Canada's Third Seacoast

"Canada's Third Seacoast" is a nickname for the St. Lawrence Seaway. Canada and the United States built the Seaway together. It was completed in 1959 and, in combination with the Great Lakes Waterway, allows large ocean-going ships to travel 2,342 miles from the Atlantic Ocean to Duluth, Minnesota, U.S.A. If you were to sail from the Atlantic Ocean to Duluth, Minnesota, U.S.A., on Lake Superior, you would travel on a river, on canals, through locks, and on lakes.
