

Countries of North America

North America is made up of 23 countries. Canada is the largest in size, while the smallest is Grenada, a tiny island nation in the Caribbean Sea. The United States of America is the second-largest country in size and includes a main landmass, known as the continental United States, as well as Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Greenland is another part of North America, but it is not a country. It is an independent territory of the Kingdom of Denmark, which is located in Europe.
