Profiles Pyramids


Geographers use graphs to compare populations in different areas. Two of the most common graphs are the population profile and the population pyramid.

Population Profile

A population profile is a bar graph that shows the different age groups of a population that shares something in common, such as language, dog ownership, or a school.

Population Pyramid

A population pyramid is a bar graph that depicts a total population by breaking it down into age groupings and gender.



By comparing the population pyramids for Booktown and Wetherby, you can see that a larger percentage of Booktown's population is aged 10–19 than Wetherby's. That is because the Boys Academy of Reading, an all-male middle and high school, brings hundreds of school-age boys into Booktown each year, skewing the population in that age group.
