## Tierra del Fuego

Tierra del Fuego is an *archipelago*, or a group of islands, located at the southern tip of South America. The name *Tierra del Fuego* means "land of fire." The islands were given that name in 1520 by Portuguese navigator Ferdinand Magellan when he saw from his ship the many fires that native Indians had made to keep warm. Because the islands are so close to Antarctica, the climate of Tierra del Fuego is extremely cold.

The Tierra del Fuego archipelago is made up of one large island and many smaller ones. The main island, which is also called Tierra del Fuego, is divided between Argentina and Chile. The eastern side belongs to Argentina. The western side and all of the smaller islands belong to Chile. In the west, the Andes Mountains extend down to the small islands. The tallest mountain in Tierra del Fuego is Mount Darwin at 7,999 feet (2,438 m). The route that Magellan sailed between Tierra del Fuego and the mainland of Chile is now called the Strait of Magellan. Although dangerous, it is much less treacherous than sailing around Cape Horn, the small island at the southernmost tip of Tierra del Fuego. The opening of the Panama Canal between North and South America in 1914 reduced the need for ships to use either of these routes.



## Angel Falls

Angel Falls is the highest waterfall in the world. It is located on the Churun River in the Guiana Highlands of Venezuela. The river flows over a flat-topped mountain called Auyantepui and plunges 3,212 feet (979 m) to the bottom.

Angel Falls was named for Jimmie Angel, an American pilot who was the first person to fly over the falls in an airplane. Another name for the falls is *Kerepakupai merú*. This name, given by natives, means "waterfall of the deepest place."

Angel Falls is surrounded by dense rainforest, making it difficult for tourists to visit. In order to see the falls, most visitors travel by plane to a camp. There, they can take a boat up the river to the bottom of the falls. Other people fly by the falls in an airplane. However, if the day is cloudy, they may not get to see the falls at all.
